Proposed Bond Measure 30-167



Proposed Features for New Station:

- Separate, secure areas for victims, suspects, and staff.
- Proper physical and digital evidence storage.
- Modern communications and emergency back-up systems.
- Decontamination areas, gym space and break rooms.
- Community space for events, trainings, and crisis hub.
- Replaces 40-year-old triple wide mobile home.

Bond Measure 30-167 would authorize the collection of property tax revenue to pay for the new police station.

If the measure passes:

- Creates a property tax rate of **\$0.27 per \$1,000 of assessed value** on residential, industrial, and commercial property, including enterprise zone corporations.
- Median residential property taxpayer would pay about **\$35 per year, or \$2.85 per month**, for 20 years.
- **Enterprise zone corporations would pay 93.5% of the cost**, local property taxes would pay 6.5% of the cost.
- Every \$1 paid by local property taxes would be matched by \$14.50 from enterprise zone corporations.

If the measure does not pass:

The proposed station would not be funded with a general obligation bond and property taxes would not be increased. The City of Umatilla would seek other funding options for the project, including a full faith and credit loan with debt service paid from the general fund.
